
New EU Tyre Label - What you need to know


Starting from 1 May 2021, new rules:




maximising safety minimising environmental impact









The new system will only have 5 grades from A to E.

Fuel efficiency & noise levels

- The fuel efficiency class ranges from A (most efficient) to E (least efficient).
- 'A' tyre = less rolling resistance
 & lower energy costs.
- The external noise class ranges include A (less noise outside the vehicle) and B (more noise).

Wet grip performance

- Tyres will no longer be allowed in classes F and G for rolling resistance and for wet grip, which is why the new scale has only 5 classes (A to E).
- Info on tyres that are specifically designed for use in severe snow & ice conditions should be included on the tyre label.
