ACT for more ACCESSIBILITY in Europe!

For all too long, ANEC has been <u>pressing</u> for regulatory action underpinned by standards to increase the access of consumers of all ages and abilities to everyday products and services. We <u>welcomed</u> the European Commission proposal for a European Accessibility Act (COM(2015) 615final), adopted on 2 December 2015, as it aimed to improve the functioning of the EU internal market for accessible products and services by removing barriers created by divergent laws.

The proposal for a EAA is now being discussed in the European Parliament, and the recently published draft report of the Committee on Internal Market and Consumer Protection (IMCO) is disappointing, as it waters down the Commission proposal. The report threatens to lead to an unambitious position of the Parliament, which will not represent the interests of EU consumers, nor promote their rights effectively, including 80 million persons with disabilities, and 190 million citizens aged 50 and older. ANEC, together with EDF and AGE, expressed its concern about the direction the IMCO report is taking, in an open letter to MEPs which draws their attention to several elements of the report which threaten the Act.

Today, prior to the IMCO meeting on the European Accessibility Act, ANEC adds its voice to that of EDF in asking the Parliament to ACT for a strong and ambitious Act. ENDS.
